

ExxonMobil Has Given \$61,000 To The Sedition Caucus As Its CEO Raised Unfounded Concerns About "Secure Elections"

SUMMARY: Following the insurrection on January 6, 2021, ExxonMobil responded to calls to halt campaign contributions by claiming that it has "[a robust process](#)" for reviewing its political spending and candidates' "consistency with the company's priorities.". However, the company has given [\\$61,000](#) to the Sedition caucus, so far in 2021.

Although ExxonMobil has [touted](#) a belief that "registering and voting" are among the "important rights and responsibilities of the citizens of a democracy," an Accountable.US review has found that the company has been tied to other anti-democratic efforts beyond the insurrection:

- ExxonMobil has given at least [\\$72,500](#) to Texas Governor Greg Abbott—who [helped advance and signed into law](#) the state's "sweeping" voter restrictions—and [\\$5,750](#) to Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton—who called the restrictions "[great](#)" and who has targeted [72%](#) of his voter fraud cases against people of color.
- As voter suppression efforts advanced in Georgia, ExxonMobil's CEO perpetuated misleading claims about voter fraud by [stating](#), "secure elections and broad access to voting are not mutually exclusive." Voter fraud is actually "[very rare](#)" and two of [trump's own](#) top officials found no widespread fraud in the 2020 election.

ExxonMobil's actions contradict its claims that it promotes "[stable](#)" public policies, helps to "[improve social conditions](#)," and that it [observes](#) the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights—which [states](#), "the will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government," as expressed through "genuine elections."

Following The January 6, 2021 Insurrection, ExxonMobil Stated That Its "PAC Contributions Are Continually Reviewed" And Claimed It Has "A Robust Process To Assess The Candidate's Platform, Prior Voting Record, And Consistency With The Company's Priorities." "PAC contributions are continually reviewed. Previous contributions to a candidate do not indicate that the ExxonMobil PAC will contribute again in the future. Before giving to any political candidate, the ExxonMobil PAC has a robust process to assess the candidate's platform, prior voting record, and consistency with the company's priorities."
