

# The National Cattlemen's Beef Association PAC—Which Gave \$154,500 To The Sedition Caucus—Has Failed To Address The Effects Of Its Political Spending

**SUMMARY:** The National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) PAC has given \$154,500 to the Sedition Caucus. The NCBA [represents more than 175,000 cattle producers and feeders throughout the U.S.](#), yet the group has not addressed its political donations to lawmakers who contributed to the January 6 insurrection and/or voted against certifying the results of the 2020 presidential election.

Notably, major corporate members of the NCBA's [product council](#) condemned the insurrection or paused contributions following the events of January 6—including [McDonald's](#), [Tyson](#), and [Cargill](#).
